

Albany Township Minutes  
March 12, 2019

The Town Board met at the Town Hall with all members present. The Pledge of Allegiance was shared. Proof of posting verified in three places and published. Minutes of the January meeting were read and approved. No meeting was held in February due to snow storm.

Treasurer's report: The Treasurer reported \$68,764.21 in Checking; \$270,250.56 in Savings; \$83,984.41 in the Building Fund; \$45,165.63 in the Machinery Fund and \$20,049.22 in the Reassessment Fund. A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Krupke to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public Input: Luke Mazanet lives on the gravel road part of Emanuel Estates and is wondering how to go about getting the road sealed. There are 7 houses there and a spot for another one. The Township does not own the road. Our engineer could be hired by the residents to determine how much it would cost to fix the road to the Township specifications. Scott Roth questioned whether the Town had any ordinances for wind towers or solar farms. There is nothing in place at this time.

Website: Jody Sterr was present to discuss doing a website for the Town. She will look into it and get back to us.

Plan Commission: The next meeting will be April 3.

Roads and Driveway Permits: A check will be received from Wisconsin Emergency Mgmt. for repair work done on Decatur-Albany Rd. in 2018 due to some road being washed out by flooding. A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Krupke to refund \$500.00 to Mike O'Connell for the completion of his driveway. Motion carried 3-0. Estimates will be gotten for paving the road over the new Tin Can culvert.

Building Inspector: Four permits given out. A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Krupke to assume responsibility for electrical wiring, installation and inspection done by the Building Inspector. Motion carried 3-0.

Assessor: No report.

Insurance: Insurance card needed for the new truck.

Library: Carolyn Seaver is the new director at the Albertson Library. Robb Spangler will be going off as President and Roald Henderson will be the new President. A new Town representative will be needed on the Board.

Recycling: Acceptance Day is April 27. Discussion held on changes to the amounts owed by the Town for the center.

Payment of Bills: A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Krupke to approve the bills as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Other Business: Spangler and the rest of the Board want to thank Ron Krupke for being Supervisor for two years and dedicated work on the recycling committee. We wish him well and he will continue as Patrolman for the Town. The Board also wants to thank Robb Spangler for 15 years of service on the Town Board and for the committees he has worked on. April 2 is spring election. The next regular Board meeting will be held April 16 at 6:30 following the Annual meeting at 6:00.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Spangler and seconded by Krupke to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
