

Albany Township Minutes
September 10, 2019

The Town Board met at the Town Hall with all members present. The Pledge of Allegiance was shared. Proof of posting at Town Hall, Recycling Center, on the Website and published.

Approval of August minutes: A motion was made by Roth and seconded by Schultz to approve the August minutes. Motion carried 3-0.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer reported \$107,053.25 in Checking; \$270,433.05 in Savings; \$84,090.34 in the Building Fund; \$55,225.76 in the Machinery Fund and \$22,559.67 in the Reassessment Fund. The August tax settlement of \$79,447.58 was received. A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Roth to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public Input: Future input on ATV and UTV travel in the Township.

Website: Advertisement listed for a Deputy Clerk. Grace had a call from someone wanting to advertise on the website. The item was table for this meeting. Items of interest to new residents will be put on the website such as recycling center, utility company, telephone company, etc.

Plan Commission Report: Justin and Courtney Smith considering a split on Conservation Rd. Jed Keepers also considering splitting land on Dunphy Rd. Sugar River Crossing is requesting a resolution to vacate roads in the plat. A resolution was available and signed by the Chairman and the Clerk. It will be published and posted. A check for \$5,000.00 was received from the subdivision group.

Roads and Driveway Permits: A driveway permit was given to Brandon and Morgan Williams in Proverbs Pass. Schultz has the passer packet required by WI DOR. The County puts the information in for the Township. The price of salt will be \$91.00 per ton, 50/50 will be \$51.00 per yard and brine will be \$.29 per gallon for this winter. The Towns Association sent a letter telling of a one-time project from WI DOT which the state will pay 90% of a minimum \$50,000.00 project.

Building Inspector: One house permit and 2 smaller permits.

Assessor: No report.

Insurance: No report.

Library: Carolyn Seaver, the new library director, was present to introduce herself and tell what is happening at the library. Goals are a place for teens to work on computers and play board games, etc., after school for younger kids as well, and morning coffee time. The library has 21,900 items in circulation, 11,600 visits which averages about 58 per day for the year. There are visits to the school, Albany Oaks, crafts and monthly book club. Also a paper was signed to exempt the Township from paying the Green County Library Tax.

Recycling: Cement on the east side of the building was torn out and new cement poured on February 6. Krupke was not advised on helping with the project. The brush pile needs to be removed. Lawrence talked to the trucker and he will do it. October 19 is fall acceptance day.

Fire and Ambulance, Building Security and Cemetery no reports.

Other Business: Discussion held on the printer. Election training will be all day on September 17. Five election workers will be attending. A motion was made by Lawrence and seconded by Schultz to pay the \$10.00 fee for each person. Motion carried 3-0. The October meeting will be on the 8th.

Payment of Bills: Checks were not available because of server problem with TownHall Software. Bills were presented. A motion was made by Roth and seconded by Lawrence to approve the payment of the bills contingent on the summary when it is available. Motion carried 3-0.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Lawrence and seconded by Roth to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 3-0.
