

Albany Township Minutes  
April 21, 2020

The Town Board was conducted by tele-conference at 6:30 p.m. All members were present. The notice was posted in three places, published and one the website.

Approval of March Minutes: A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Roth to approve the March minutes as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer reported \$222,893.61 in Checking; \$210,503.5 in Savings; \$84,213.13 in the Building Fund; \$65,312.99 in the Machinery Fund and \$25,073.53 in the Reassessment Fund. Noteworthy deposits were Highway Aids, \$26,753.04 and Lottery Credit, \$90,285.57. A question was raised why the Lottery Credit was so much higher than before. The Treasurer will check to see about it. A motion was made by Roth and seconded by Schultz to approve the Treasurer's report as received except for the Lottery Credit amount. Motion carried 3-0. The Treasurer corrected the amount of Lottery Credit to \$10,350.65. A revised Treasurer's report will be at the next meeting.

Approval of Land Division for Nate & Ashley Miller: The approval is on hold for the time being since the surveyor is not finished and some things need to be corrected. This will be on the May agenda.

Driveway Permits and Road Work: Paver Patching on Brooklyn-Albany Rd. would be \$32,170; Condon Rd. \$2,706.00; Atkinson Rd. would be \$15,147.00 less \$8,000.00 for doing dura patch or \$7,147.00; and Oiiiver Rd would be \$18,375.00 for a total of \$60,398.00. The budget for 2020 is \$130,000.00. The plan is to do all paver patch, crack fill Bump Rd., \$12,339.00; Bud Ln., \$3,355 and Wild Iris Way, \$8,009.00. To seal Tin Can Rd., \$13,156.00; and possibly Stephenson Ln, \$13,003.00. The English Settlement Bridge needs some work on the inlet especially the north and east side of the bridge. Proverbs Pass has a sink hole that will cost \$2,641.00 to repair. Peckham Rd has been damaged by manure haulers for Pinnacle Dairy. Tuls has said they will do the repairs necessary to get it fixed. Towns Rd. is in need of grading. Psalms Way has some damage. Cold patch will be put on by Krupke. A motion was made by Lawrence and seconded by Schultz to approve 2020 road work as presented in the amount of \$127,891.

Approval of Tables and Chairs: Four tables and five chairs were ordered from Office Pro, Inc . at a cost of \$2,421.00. A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Roth to approve the purchase of the office equipment form Office Pro costing \$2,421.00. Motion carried 3-0. Discussion was held on what to do with the current furniture. No decision made at this time.

Payment of Bills: A motion was made by Roth and seconded by Schultz to approve the payment of bills as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Postponing and Rescheduling of Annual Meeting: A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Roth to postpone the April 21 Annual Meeting. Motion carried 3-0. Rescheduling will be done when Governor Evers Executive Order #72 expires. If the Order #72 expires on May 12, the earliest the annual

meeting could be held is 61 days later which would be by July 12. A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Roth to postpone the Annual meeting until after the Executive Order 72 expires. Motion carried 3-0.

Other Business: Discussion held on whether Ron Krupke should have time off for the Covid-19 Safer at Home order. He would be reimbursed for this time off. Lawrence did not feel that there was much risk because of being out in the open air and working 95% of his time alone. Schultz made a motion seconded by Roth that Ron be off two weeks and paid \$18.50 per hour for 25 hours per week pending answer from Wisconsin Towns Assn. regarding this matter. Motion carried 2-0 with Lawrence voting no.

Board or Review: The Open Book and Board of Review will not be set until the Department of Revenue gives guidelines on when they can be held. The Board of Review will need to be opened in the normal time frame and then closed to another date.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Schultz and seconded by Lawrence to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 3-0.
